**New From TCG Books:
The Flu Season And Other Plays
Three works by Will Eno, author of *Thom Pain (based on nothing)***

NEW YORK—Theatre Communications Group (TCG) is pleased to announce the publication of ***The Flu Season and Other Plays*** by Will Eno, the first collection of his work, which contains ***The Flu Season***, ***Intermission*** and ***Tragedy: a tragedy***. Eno is also the author of the critically acclaimed play *Thom Pain (based on nothing)*, which ran for a year Off-Broadway and was a finalist for the 2005 Pulitzer Prize. ***The Flu Season***, which won the Oppenheimer Award for best debut by an American playwright, is set in a mental health institution and in a theatre. In Eno’s own words, “It is a play about the difficulty of love, the difficulty of being human, of making art.” ***Intermission*** is a short work also set in the theatre, during the intermission of a play called *The Mayor*. The third Eno play in the volume, ***Tragedy: a tragedy***, premiered in London and received its first U.S. production this past season in Berkeley, CA, and was excerpted in *Harper’s* magazine. It is set during a live television broadcast.

In his preface to ***Tragedy: a tragedy***, Eno writes: “Something is on television, relentlessly. A plane crash, probably...Before it all, whatever it is, stands a dashing reporter, talking. Perfectly groomed, dressed in appropriate clothing, properly grave as the moment demands. His teeth are amazing... He stands for us, somehow, standing there. He stands for us standing here wondering what we’re standing here for. Us, in the wrong place, the wrong time, in a sort of rapture, with life behind us. Us, with only the early technology of our vocabulary, a tongue, trying to identify the rapturous, trying to sum up the miraculous, standing right in front of it. Possibly.”

Will Eno is also the author of ***Oh, the Humanity and other good intentions***, as well as ***Thom Pain (based on nothing)***, the hit play that ran for one year Off-Broadway, following its award-winning success at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe. It was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize.
