**Today, Over 200 People Attend  
Union Square Rally to Launch**

Theatre Communications Group's

***Free Night of Theater in New York City!***

115 Off-Broadway theaters offer 8,000 FREE tickets

- WHO:** Theatre Communications Group (TCG), the national organization for not-for-profit theatre and its New York partners the Arts & Business Council of New York, The Alliance of Resident Theatres/New York, The League of Off-Broadway Theatres and Producers, the League of Independent Theater, The New York State Council on the Arts, and Theatre Development Fund.
- WHAT:** TCG's fourth annual ***Free Night of Theater*** had its NYC launch today in Union Square. The program was introduced as a three-city pilot program in 2005 to raise the general awareness of America's not-for-profit theatres and attract new and non-traditional audiences. This year the national program is making more than 55,000 tickets available to 650 theatres in over 120 cities in 26 states. A complete list of the 120 participating cities and theatres is available at [www.freenightoftheater.net](http://www.freenightoftheater.net). ***Free Night NYC*** is offering more than 8,000 free tickets to over 100 theaters across the city in addition to hosting parties, as well as pre and post-show discussions, all designed to increase word of mouth about the program and to celebrate the diverse work of the NYC theatre community. - PROGRAM:** Renowned Broadway actor **André De Shields** (who can be seen currently in The Flea Theater's production of *CATO*) opened the program with a stirring performance of The Age of Aquarius from *HAIR* (the show that gave him his break in Chicago), and talked about the richness of theatre for both performers and audience. He was followed by TCG executive director **Teresa Eyring**, who spoke about the growth of the ***Free Night*** program and the extraordinary work of the NYC managing partners. Eyring introduced **Kate Levin**, NYC's Director of Cultural Affairs who presented Eyring with a proclamation from Mayor Bloomberg, recognizing October 16 as Free Night of Theater NYC Day! The program ended with a rousing performance by Korean break dancers, **Ballerina Who Loves B-boy**, who can be seen soon performing at 37 Arts Theatre.
